Two assessment schemas are used. The first is for progress towards EHCP outcomes. The expectations for progress, alongside the colour key to the graphs below were as follows:



Across the Trust, the EHCP targets are broken down into annual targets, which are further used to set termly targets. The data contained in this report reflects progress towards the annual targets.


Whole school progress:




97% of learners made expected or above progress towards their EHCP targets, with 7% exceeding expectations. This is equivalent to last year where 97% of learners made expected or more progress,

however, there is a slight decline in the number of learners making exceeding progress, which was 15% last year.

Therefore there was roughly equivalent progress across the four main key areas of need and learners with pupil premium indicators had progress equivalent to those without, with a slightly higher number exceeding expectations but also slightly higher not making expected progress.





Progress by AON:




Pupil Premium vs None Pupil premium progress



Therefore almost all learners made expected progress in almost all areas of need. There was a decrease in the number of learners making exceeding progress on last year, therefore improved progress towards EHCP outcomes will be a focus for this coming year.




99% of all learners made expected or more progress, with 8% exceeding.

Therefore the majority of pupils made expected or more progress in most areas of need. There was roughly equivalent progress between learners with or without pupil premium indicators, but those with pupil premium indicators made more progress overall.

Therefore, progress is above expectations for all areas. There was an improvement in Maths upon last year, with all pupils achieving expected or above progress.

Therefore those with pupil premium indicators generally equivalent progress to those without. In Maths, more learners with pupil premium indicators exceeded expectations. In English, slightly fewer did, therefore a target for the forthcoming year will be to increase the numbers of learners with pupil premium indicators making exceeding progress in reading.

Special Partnership Trust expectations: 15% emerging, 60% expected, 25% exceeded.

Therefore, progress is above Trust expectations in all areas. There is a significant improvement in the number of learners exceeding expectations on both English and Maths, with the biggest improvement in Maths. The emerging progress is linked to an attendance/health issue of a single student, therefore there are no actions related to this.

Therefore, progress in Maths was better for learners without pupil premium indicators, with more learners exceeding expectations. More learners without pupil premium indicators exceeded expectations in English than those with. Therefore, a focus for next year will be to increase the number of learners with pupil premium indicators exceeding expectations.

Therefore, progress in all areas. This is an improvement from last year with a decrease in the number of learners making emerging progress.




Progress towards EHCP/IEP outcomes by EHCP area of need, and pupil premium vs non pupil premium progress comparison.




98% of learners in this pathway made expected or more progress, with 12% of learners making exceeding progress.

Therefore the majority of learners made expected or above progress. Learners with pupil premium indicators performed slightly better than those without. This is an improvement on last year, with a decrease in the number of learners making no progress, especially those with pupil premium indicators and an increase in those learners making exceeding progress, again particularly those with pupil premium indicators.

Therefore, the progress is in line with Trust expectations for Maths and slightly above for English. This is a slight decrease on last year with fewer learners making expected or more progress, however this class had a significant number of in year joiners to the cohort.

Therefore, those with pupil premium indicators made roughly equivalent progress in English to those without but fewer exceeding expectations. Learners without pupil premium indicators made better progress in Maths than those learners with. Again, a target for this cohort will be for more learners with pupil premium indicators to exceed expectations.

Therefore, progress overall is better than Trust expectations in all areas, but slightly higher in Maths than English. This is a significant improvement on last year with fewer learners making emerging progress and more learners exceeding progress.

Therefore, those achieving expected progress is slightly below expectation in Reading and Number. In most other areas there is an improvement in learners making expected or more progress upon last year, though fewer than expected learners exceeded progress in Handling Data.



Learning to Learn pathway


Summer term progress towards EHCP/IEP outcomes by EHCP area of need, and pupil premium vs non pupil premium progress comparison.




94% of learners made expected or more progress, with 2% making exceeding progress.

Therefore, the majority of learners made expected or more progress. Those with pupil premium indicators dod not make as much progress as those without.

Summary:

Strengths:

 Achievement continue to be in line with, but mostly above Trust expectations in the majority of areas.

- The attainment gap between the Bridging to Learn and Ready to Learn cohorts continues to decrease.
- Progress towards Preparing for Adulthood targets has significantly improved, showing impact of the new post 14 Curriculum.
- There is an increase in learners with pupil premium indicators in KS 4 &5 exceeding progress in English and Maths. There is a significant improvement in the Bridging to Learn cohort of Key Stage 4 & 5 who make expected or more progress, particularly in Maths,
- Within Key stage 3 there is a significant improvement in Maths for the Ready to Learn cohort, and in all areas for the Bridging to Learn cohort.

Areas for development:

- A whole school review of Annual Targets to ensure that these are purposeful and measurable, ensuring more learners are able to achieve established or generalised outcomes. Monitoring has shown this to be an area for development that will improve attainment overall.
- For the more learners with pupil premium indicators to exceed expectations, equivalent to those without pupil premium indicators in the following areas: KS 1&2 Ready to Learn reading, Bridging to Learn in all areas. Key stage 3 Bridging to Learn English
- In the Early Years, more pupils need to make established and generalised progress towards EHCP targets.

These areas will be addressed through out school development plan for the forthcoming year.

Last year's areas for development:

- EYFS close the attainment gap between PP and non-PP. Attainment between these two
 cohorts is now roughly equitable, though there will be a new target to raise the member of
 students making established or generalised progress
- Ready to Learn pathway Close the gap in exceeding progress for learners with pupil
 premium indicators within National Curriculum areas. Completed. Progress is now 20% for
 English and 67% for Maths,
- Bridging to Learn increase the number of learners making progress towards Preparing for Adulthood targets. Completed. All learners made expected or more progress, with 20% exceeding expected progress.
- Bridging to Learn increase progress in Reading for KS3 and Geometry and Measures in KS4&5. Completed. IN KS3 Reading progress is now 90% in comparison to 71% the year before. In KS4/5, the progress is 100% in comparison to 55% the year before.
- Continue to close the gap between learners in the Bridging to Learn pathway. Completed, the year on year progress continues to improve for the Bridging to Learn cohort.
