We are looking forward to having you all in school full time to establish new routines and explore new areas around school. We have begun exploring our preferred areas of interest during our successful stay and play sessions and will continue to engage with these and other new experiences as we find our feet in our new class. We will be learning all about venturing Into The Woods, linking closely to Autumn. ### **Emotional Development**

We are going to be learning about exploring and sharing new spaces and resources with new friends, establishing relationships with peers and adults who will support us with managing ourselves in terms of personal care and engaging with others. We will have areas such as a sensory studio and sensory integration room to allow us to engage in a sensory diet each day.

#### Communication & Language

As part of early reading and understanding of language we will be experiencing object/on -body/auditory/photo/symbol cues and visual timetables. We will be listening and participating in Nursery rhymes through our spinning song sack and sharing attention with What's in the box games. We will be anticipating what sounds, textures, visuals may be within the box to keep our attention. We will learn some vocabulary linked to it.

## Physical/Sensory

We will begin to explore our bodies and what we can do through daily sensorimotor sessions, soft play, sensory circuits and outdoor play. Some of us will be moving our bodies in a range of textures moving, reaching and grasping, whilst others will be discovering a range of equipment. Fine motor skills will be encouraged through messy play, construction, loose parts and sensory trays.

### Thinking/Cognition

Here we focus on our individual Personal learning goals - this relates to early development within the EYFS area of Mathematics. Number rhymes will relate to our topic and build on child led interests. We will be developing anticipation and exploring cause and effect. We may explore spatial reasoning through transporting, pouring, as well as other early maths skills such as sorting and matching.
