Welcome to Oak Class





Term:

Autumn 2

We hope you had a lovely half term. This term in Oak, we will continue to explore our preferred areas of interest and focus on developing our listening and attention through phonic and maths group sessions. In Oak we will be continuing our topic "Into The Woods", linking closely to Autumn. Outdoor play and learning will enable further widened experiences in all 7 areas of the Early Years Curriculum - further exploring the season of Autumn. We will be focusing on The Very Hungry Caterpillar's First Autumn and The Gruffalo as our key texts through sensory experiences. This term, we will continue to use the wider areas in the school to develop our skills further.

Personal, Social and

Emotional Development

We are going to be focusing on engaging with washing and drying hands and communicating the need for food and drink when we are hungry or thirsty. In Oak, we will be developing our engagement when playing social games and singing songs, this will be linked to our daily phonics and maths. The children will continue to be directed to activities to allow them to develop self calming techniques.

Communication & Language

In Oak, as part of our Early understanding of sounds we will be doing daily phonics sessions through bucket time. This will be focusing on environmental sounds. instruments and body percussion. We will also have a sound of the week focus. The children will be listening to and joining in with sensory stories, as well accessing our whole school Online Safety story sack, Goldilocks. We will use choice boards for our favourite stories and nursery rhymes for reading for pleasure.

Physical/Sensory

We will continue to explore our bodies through sensorimotor sessions, soft play, sensory circuits and outdoor play. Some of us will be learning to roll a ball more accurately, whilst some will be working on their catching and throwing skills. We will be starting our sensory group in the SI room. Fine motor skills will be explored through a multisensory approach and we will be focusing on using a singular finger to indicate our needs.

Maths/Cognition

We are developing our bank of number rhymes this term with Makaton. This will be part of our Bucket Time sessions for Maths. We are going to access prepositional language and counting through playful interactions and group sessions. We will use opportunities both inside and outside to widen our learning opportunities. We will be focusing on numbers up to 10 and matching identical objects. Some children will be sorting using colours and sizes of objects.
