We hope you had a lovely Easter holiday! In Oak this term, our topic will be "Out and about". We will be exploring different areas such as the beach and parks. This term, we will be continuing to work on our phonics and mathematical skills through our group bucket sessions and teacher-led activities. All of the children will be introduced to their own Teacch trays working on activities personalised to their own PLG's. Our key texts this term will be 'Sharing a shell' and 'The snail and the whale', we will be looking at these books through different sensory experiences. This term, we will continue to swimming as part of our physical development learning. During this term, we will be taking part in the bikability program, please keep a look out for further information regarding this as we may need some parent helpers.

## **Emotional Development**

This term, we will be continuing to focus on communicating for food and drink using symbols and choice boards. We will be focusing on building relationships with peers and sharing different resources. The children will continue to work on understanding when an activity is finished we need to tidy up. We will be working on opening and closing different Velcro and zips to help the children independently undo their clothes when toileting.

#### Communication & Language

In Oak, as part of our Early understanding of sounds we will be doing daily phonics sessions through bucket time. This will be focusing on environmental sounds, instruments, body percussion, rhythm and rhyme, alliteration and voice sounds. We will also continue our sound of the week focus. The children will be listening to and joining in with sensory stories, joining in with our end of day story and reading their library books. Choice boards will be used for our favourite stories and nursery rhymes for reading for pleasure.

### Physical/Sensory

We will continue to explore our bodies through sensorimotor sessions, soft play, sensory circuits and outdoor play. In Oak, we will be learning how to kick, roll and throw a ball accurately to a target and to our peers. We will be doing swimming weekly and physical activities weekly in the yard. Fine motor skills will be explored through a multisensory approach and we will be focusing on using spoons to scoop, tripod grip, pressing switches and turning knobs and threading beads.

### Maths/Cognition

We will continue to develop our bank of nursery rhymes and songs linked to maths using Makaton. This will be part of our Bucket Time sessions for Maths. We are going to access shape, counting and positional language through playful interactions and group sessions. We will be continuing to focusing on numbers up to 10 and using construction to create different structures. All of the children have their own maths teacch trays linked to their personal PLG targets which will be done daily 1:1 with the children.
