### **Safer Internet Day**

On Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> February we will be joining schools and youth organisations across the UK in celebrating Safer Internet Day 2025.

Safer Internet Day is a global campaign to promote the safe and responsible use of technology, which calls on children and young people, parents, carers, teachers, social workers, law enforcement, companies, policymakers and more, to help create a better and safer internet environment.

Using the internet safely and positively is a key message that we promote in school and celebrating Safer Internet Day is a great opportunity for us to re-emphasise the online safety messages we deliver throughout the year.

We would be delighted if you could join us in celebrating the day by continuing the conversation at home. The theme for internet safety this year is 'Too good to be true? Protecting yourself and others from scams online.' We will also be looking at how to protect ourselves from scams, for example not sharing personal information, having secure passwords and avoiding pop-ups. We are linking this to our PSHE curriculum. Whether you have 5 minutes to start a conversation or hours to spare, there are top tips, quizzes and films which can be used at home with your child.
