# Autumn Tree Finger Painting Activity



## You will need:

- Blank Tree Template (optional)
- white paper or card
- red, yellow, orange and brown paint
- paint palette or mixing tray
- brown crayon



Some ingredients and/or materials used might cause allergic reactions or health problems. You should ensure that you are fully aware of the allergies and health conditions of those taking part. ## Instructions:

- 1 Before the activity, print the Blank Tree Template onto white paper or card, or draw your own (make sure you don't draw on any leaves).
- 2 If you are using the black and white version, ask your child to use a brown crayon to colour in the tree.
- 3 Pour the paint into the paint palette or mixing tray.
- 4 Ask your child to dip their finger in the paint and then place their finger on the paper to add leaves to their tree.
- 5 Let your child experiment with mixing different colours to create different shades. They can also use different fingers to create different sized leaves.
- 6 You can also encourage your child to add some leaves around the bottom of their picture to represent the leaves that have fallen from the trees. Talk to your child about why the leaves might have fallen.
- 7 Leave your finger painting to dry and then it is complete!
