Dear Parents and Carers



This week we are all learning about being safe online. We will be looking at how we can be safe, secure and know who can help us when we are accessing the internet. Our activities in class will be relevant and appropriate for each learning phase. We have sent an internet safety guide to all parents/ carers this week with updates on the best literature and links to pages that can keep us all up to date and safe while using a variety of online and media platforms.



Maple class have been learning about science and Changing State this half term. We have enjoyed learning about the water cycle and the evaporation and condensation stages. Last week we created our own water cycle to observe over time and made a science display to help us remember the process.



This week in Elm class, we have been busy learning our life skills, especially washing the dishes.

We have also been very busy working on our Enterprise activities making Christmas gifts for our Christmas catalogue. Here we are making reindeer food!



Cherry class are making the Boxing Day pickle for our Christmas catalogue. The learners all put on their PPE and scrubbed their hands very carefully before they got chopping, stirring and sampling all the different sensory fare. We took the opportunity while being chef, to practise our catering and cleaning life skills.





In Rowan class we have been learning about the different seasons and the associated weather. We used different materials in our sensory story to replicate the sounds and the feel of certain weather, and used our senses to learn the difference between them.



In Cedar and Holly class we have been participating in activities relating to Anti Bullying week. We shared and coloured in activity items that made us smile, which linked to our 'Be Kind' theme.



In redwood class we have been exploring what it feels like to share with our friends. We used the co-op band to feel each other's movements and dance to music on the Resonance boards.

In Apple class, for Children in Need Day we all wore our comfy clothes and thought about what other things make us happy. We spent the day doing all our favourite things which included sensory and cause and effect learning through play.



We are continuing to develop our opportunities for parental engagement. Our next priority will be to develop our use of the Evidence for Learning app to include parents. This is an IPad app where we capture evidence of our student's learning in action.



We will aim to trail parental access to this in a few classes starting in January. Further news will follow.
