Some of learners in key stage 2 and 3 have been enjoying the opportunity to go off site for swimming lessons at Polkyth Leisure centre this, and last week. The extra lessons have been very popular, and all of our learners behaved very responsibly with the transition from school to the centre, on the bus. Thank you to Active Cornwall who have funded these for our learners.



Would you like to join our Doubletrees fund raising team? Friends of Doubletrees.

The Friends of Doubletrees are a registered charity (number 1027045) who work to raise funds for Doubletrees School. Our members include ex and current parents/grandparents and school staff.



We aim to raise funds through organised fundraising activities, applying for grants and other sources of funding, and increasing the awareness of the school within the local community. The money raised is used solely to benefit the children of the school in terms of new equipment, accessing activities and supporting the development of new facilities.

Some of our fundraising efforts have paid for i-pads, waterfall playsets, sensory toys, cycle helmets, Christmas presents for the pupils, leavers presents and party, new photograph displays, dance club instructor, poly tunnel refurbishment and play equipment for the early years foundation stage (EYFS) area. Our most recent fundraising has supplied the school with its own defibrillator, which is now situated in the corridor by the library.

We have also been successful in applying for a number of grants which allow large items to be purchased like the acheeva bed, eye-gaze system, sensory room equipment and Cornubia Sailing trips. We are also lucky to receive a number of donations from individuals and groups who raise money on our behalf.

We are always looking for new members to join and support our group. We have 3 meetings a year on the school site which normally last for no more than 30 minutes. 


Redwood had great fun with the parachute in the hall this week. We showed great awareness of the ball in the middle and anticipation waiting for it to be passed around.
