

Look What We Have Learned!







Cherry & Elm Class have been very busy this week planning for their Happy Hump Day Café enterprise initiative which runs every Wednesday. First they collected orders from across the school staff team. Next they used their developing data handling skills to write lists of what they needed. Finally they were all actively engaged in wearing their PPE and making bacon and vegetarian baps for the staff team. Here we are in the school kitchen organising the bacon and veggie products to be cooked. We then began slicing and buttering up baps, back in our classroom. This work also supports the learning they are doing in RE about the link between religion and food. Cherry Class have been learning about religions where people eat meat and others follow plant based, vegetarian and vegan diets.



Redwood celebrated the start of the New Year by listening to Big Ben's chimes and counting down with party poppers. We listened to some traditional music linked to the new year from different cultures.

In Apple class we have been selecting herbs to plant in out outdoor garden. We made the experience a sensory one, exploring the plants with touch and our noses!





Maple class have been introduced to their new topic this week and have been finding out all about the country of Jamaica. They have used non-fiction books to research facts and enjoyed listening to Calypso music.



In our music lesson this week, Cedar class explored what makes a musical instrument. We explored a range of instruments and the noises that they make. Then we had a go at making our own instruments and playing them to the beat of a song!

In Willow's English reading comprehension and writing skills lessons, we have been studying the Jamaican folk tale, Tiger Soup, by Frances Temple.

During our sensory story time everyone has shown a preference for the coconut's hairy shell!

School Improvement

One of our big focuses over the next few terms is attendance and punctuality. There is a large government drive to approve attendance, following the pandemic. This is because national average school attendance has not yet returned to it's pre-pandemic levels. The Educational Welfare Service has now been made statutory, so all schools receive involvement. The focus is meant to be a supportive one. If young people are experiencing barriers to accessing their education, we are looking to work collaboratively to try and overcome these by working with parents and other relevant agencies to help overcome these.

We are also looking forward to our Internet safety week in Early February. The focus here will be identifying things that make us feel good or bad. If things make us feel bad, how do we access help? This is linked, both to our PHSE focus on relationships and also online habits—choosing what is good or bad and reporting harmful content.
