Achieve

In Apple class this week we have been using cause and effect objects and switch buttons to learn how to make choices in our communication skill lessons. We celebrated each child's achievement when a choice and successive action had been made.

Belong

This week Maple class had a great first session on the interoception curriculum. Each session the learners will focus on a part of the body to work on the "ability to notice body signals" to then be able to connect the body signal to an emotion. Our first session was Hands, we carried out various activities to alter the body signals to the hands. The learners then picked a picture to describe what their hands felt like "hot, cold, clean, dirty, wiggly, fast, slow etc" Maple class were great at identifying how their hands felt and they enjoyed the practical aspect of the experiments.



School Improvement:

We are committed to ensuring that our learner's attendance and punctuality is always a priority at Doubletrees. We thought we would take this opportunity to remind parents/carers of the process in our school with regards to this. Laura our receptionist monitors our class registers every morning to ensure that all attendances and absentees are recorded. Please ensure that if your child is not going to be in school for any reason, that you phone or leave a message in advance so we can record your reasons appropriately. If the absence is relating to a medical appointment, please send a copy of your child's appointment letter/ evidence to our enquiries in box or place a copy in your child's home/ school book. Any absences that are not recorded in advance will trigger a welfare call to your designated emergency contacts so we can establish a reason for your child being absent from school on that day. These will begin after our registers close at 9.40am. Any absences that are not requested and agreed in advance or backed with evidence will be recorded as Un-authorised. Only mandatory appointments will be authorised within school time. Pupils are expected to be onsite and ready for learning in the classroom by 9.30am. If they arrive between 9.30am and 9.40am they are recorded as late. If they arrive after 9.40am, this is recorded as half a day's unauthorised absence. If your young person is experiencing barriers with their school attendance or punctuality, we would like to work with you to support and overcome these, so please let us know. Thank you for your co-operation.





Develop

In Cherry Class we have been working on ordering new adjectives and proper nouns alphabetically, and then looking them up in the dictionary. It helps us to understand which words require a capital letter, enriches our vocabulary and helps us to develop practical skills working with dictionaries, indexes, cookery books and other non-fiction texts where alphabetical knowledge is essential.

This term in Holly's Art classes, we are exploring the painting 'Starry Night' by Van Gogh.

This week we projected an interactive version of his painting onto our classroom wall to explore and inspire us to make marks! We really enjoyed it.

HOP sessions (Hanging out program)

Our learners in Rowan and Redwood enjoyed one to one interaction with their class teams this week in their Hanging out project (HOP sessions).

The Hanging Out Program involves a commitment to spend 10 minutes with a person giving them 100% of your attention. HOP was developed with people with profound and multiple learning disabilities in mind, to promote and prioritise interaction as being a core part of the job of disability support work and to ensure that people had the opportunity to participate in meaningful interactions every day.

We monitor all 10 minute interactions and write down what happened to celebrate each learners gains, meaningful moments and build on their successes.
