#### Head Teacher's welcome:

The NEU teaching union intends to take strike action in schools on Wednesday 5th July and Friday 7th July 2023. With the first day of strike action taking place on Wednesday 5th July, I am getting in touch to give you a further update - that we will be partially opening on this day. As previously shared we are also aware that we had a pre-planned INSET day (Monday 3rd July) where the school would have been closed to pupils the same week as the recently announced strikes. After

careful consideration and in order to minimise the disruption to our families we have moved our INSET day from the Monday to the Friday of next week so that are learners are only impacted on two days rather than three days without this change. So next week will now look like this:

- •Monday 3rd July—School is open to all pupils (INSET moved to the Friday).
- •Tuesday 4th July School open as normal.
- Wednesday 5th July Strike action day and partial school closure. We have sent and email today outlining the affected classes. A copy of this letter is also available on our website and Facebook page.
- •Thursday 6th July School open as normal.
- •Friday 7th July INSET day (moved from the Monday) and strike action day. School closed to pupils.

## **Communicate**

The Friends of Doubletrees are a registered charity (number 1027045) who work to raise funds for Doubletrees School. Our members include ex and current parents/grandparents and school staff.

We aim to raise funds through organised fundraising activities, applying for grants and other sources of funding, and increasing the awareness of the school within the local community. The money raised is used solely to benefit the children of the school in terms of new equipment, accessing activities and supporting the development of new facilities.

Some of our fundraising efforts have paid for I-pads, waterfall playsets, sensory toys, cycle helmets, Christmas presents for the pupils, new photograph displays, dance clubs, polytunnel refurbishment and play equipment for the early years foundation stage (EYFS) area. A recent fundraising effort has supplied the school with its own defibrillator, which is now situated in the corridor by the library.

We have also been successful in applying for a number of grants which allow large items to be purchased like the acheeva bed, eye-gaze systems and items for our sensory room. We are also lucky to receive a number of donations from individuals and groups who raise money on our behalf.
